Jean Leonard introduced our speaker, John Stephens. John is the Executive Director and Producer of the

Little Theatre on the Square in Sullivan.

The original building was built in 1928 as a silent movie theater. In the 1950s, Guy S. Little, Jr. started renting the building for 9 weeks each summer for theatre performances. Mr. Little purchased the building in 1957. It stopped being a movie theater in the 1960s.

In 1981, the theatre became a not-for-profit organization that purchased the building from Mr. Little. The following year it purchased and renovated the adjoining building for its ticket office, public restrooms and administrative offices. The theatre continued to grow and add amenities for its patrons and production company. In 2000, the organization purchased another building for rehearsal space, a dance studio and apartments to house the company. Another building was purchased in 2001 and converted into a technical production facility.

This summer is the 67th season. About 50,000 people attend performances each year. Since the beginning, over one million people have enjoyed the performances at Little Theatre. This summer 55 adults including technical and backstage personnel and 27 children will present this season offerings. There are seven year-round staff members. John has been with Little Theatre for 16 years.

Auditions are done via video and in person at Sullivan and two in Chicago.

To provide additional fundraising, the theatre has opened Second Act Thrift Shop at 206 South Vine in downtown Sullivan.



You can drop off your household/clothing donations at the shop or the theatre. All proceeds benefit Little Theatre.

The process to put together a season starts every summer....select the shows, procure the rights to produce the shows, hold auditions, select the casts, line up the backstage/technical people, and organize all the "nuts & bolts" that put everything together to make it happen. Just the sets for each show cost around \$3,500.

John generously offered a drawing for free tickets. Kim Higgins was the winner.

<u>Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive for SAM</u> <u>Pantry Results</u> – 1,864.5 pounds of food was collected and \$1,006.00 in cash/checks. Converting the dollars into pounds (\$1 X 3 pounds) a total of 4,882.5 equivalent pounds of food was collected. In addition, \$751.70 was donated during the "round-up" week at Kirby Foods. Great job!

<u>K-Kids Update</u> – At the K-Kids picnic, Beth Linstead, announced that she was stepping down as K-Kids Faculty Advisor. She has served in this position for many, many years. In past years, the club has honored Beth for her service and leadership with a Zeller Fellowship and Amador Medallion awards. Logan Donnals and Ashleigh Sterkel, 4th grade teachers are stepping up to share the K-Kids Faculty Advisor position. <u>Flesor's Candy Kitchen Renovation</u> – Devon Story provided an update on the building renovations. 

1. Consent Agenda –

The Spring is a busy time for club members with Fish Fry, Egg Hunt, and Food Drive. After discussion, Janet Butler made a motion to discontinue the Spring Pancake Breakfast. Ian seconded the motion and it was approved.

- 7. <u>Little Free Library</u> Ian reported that he had restocked the Health Center. Funds were approved to purchase additional pre-school books. See details under Disbursements.

The Board discussed its options. As a not-for-profit club and a 501c3 foundation, we can't do any funding or donating as an organization or foundation. Due to the major rebuilding of the east wall, Flesor's will be moving their candy counters to the room we meet during the renovation. We will temporarily be meeting in the "buffet" room. We don't have a date, but it will be soon.
- 3. <u>Easter Bunny Costume</u> Kim reported the bunny costume needs cleaning. After discussion, Carol Martin made a motion to authorize Kim to take it for a professional cleaning. David Butler seconded the motion, and it was approved.
- 4. <u>Tuscola Community Foundation Application</u> Kim Higgins reported that Janet Butler and she were working on a TCF application requesting funds to pay for the club storage unit rent over three years. It was suggested that the cost of the contents insurance be added as well. Kim agreed do to so.
